ANALYSING THE LOCAL CONTEXT AND NEEDS WITH COMMUNITIES

The first step in any CAHW programme is to ascertain that training CAHWs is a relevant solution to the needs expressed by the community. For this, participatory analysis with all relevant stakeholders is critical. This will allow to tailor the future CAHW programme to the local context.



Carry out a participatory **needs** assessment with livestock keepers:

Use participatory approaches and methods for livestock keepers to identify and prioritise the main animal diseases and livestock problems encountered in the area.

Make sure to include in this analysis all members of the community, including women, youth and other marginalized groups.

Among the animal diseases and livestock problems identified, distinguish those that can be handled by CAHWs and those that will need to be handled by the other animal health service providers of the area.

Conduct a participatory **analysis**

of the local context:

Identify opportunities (e.g. density of livestock, enabling

institutional environment) and threats (e.g. inadequate infrastructure, unfair competition) that need to be anticipated to set up the CAHW programme. See more potential opportunities and threats in **Pillar 2** of the Handbook

During this first phase, mapping




the existing workforce is key! ■ Identify the animal health service providers such as

vets, VPPs and CAHWs already active in the area that can be positively or negatively impacted by the deployment of CAHWs. Think carefully the **number and location of future CAHWs to be trained** to ensure equity in service access

to livestock keepers without creating oversupply.
