

PILLAR 5 | PLANNING FOR SUPERVISION AND CONTINUING TRAINING

Supervision of CAHWs is important to:

- ➔ Guarantee the quality of services provided to livestock keepers;
- ➔ Strengthen the motivation of CAHWs and the relationship of trust between CAHWs and their supervisor;
- ➔ Encourage acceptance and support from local veterinary authorities and communities;
- ➔ Encourage their institutional recognition.

1. Favour linking CAHWs to a private vet or VPP to ensure regular and sustainable supervision and mentoring:

- **CAHWs** visit the vet/VPP for resupply and technical advice;
- **Vet/VPPs** collaborating with CAHWs expand the geographical coverage of their services and inputs sales, hence expanding their customer base.

Win-win situation:

CAHWs and vets/VPPs work in a complementary rather than competitive manner.



2. Select a supervisor who demonstrates good interpersonal skills and willingness to mentor CAHWs.



You may consider providing supervisors with some basic training on human resource management, communication, etc.

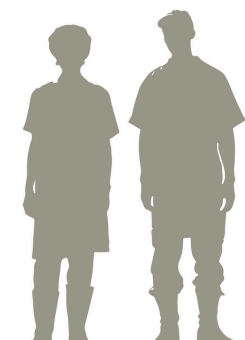
3. Base the CAHW monitoring system on simple, standardized and clear tools. Plan for regular field visits and involve the community in the monitoring system.



Tools can be developed digitally to ease data collection and analysis.



4. Formalise the collaboration framework between the CAHW and the supervisor: specify the duration, location and scope of CAHW activities and clarify the commitments, rights and obligations of both parties.



5. When security allows, provide CAHWs with visibility aids such as badges or uniforms



These support their **legitimacy and credibility** with livestock keepers and allow them to be distinguished from self-proclaimed actors.

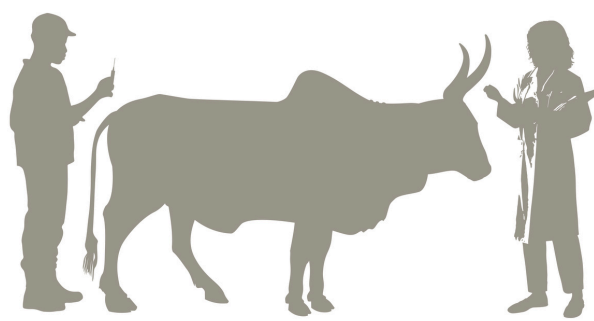
6. Adapt the content of continued training to the needs identified during monitoring field visits (based on the shortcomings witnessed, the evolution of local disease context, etc.)

7. Every opportunity is a good one to strengthen CAHW skills:

- during in-person training sessions;
- during monitoring visits in the field;
- using Information and Communication Technologies (ICT)...

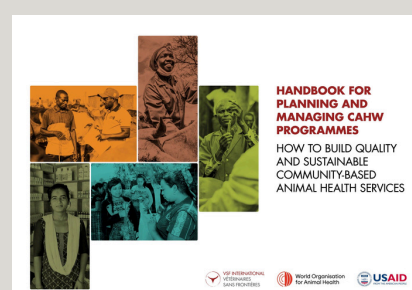


WhatsApp groups are particularly successful for knowledge exchange and technical advice.
